# 1.2 About the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform

### **Technical requirements**

The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform is based on the Moodle Learning Platform.

The HEIDENHAIN platform is updated automatically and in accordance with the updating intervals of Moodle.

The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform can be used as a browser-based application both on stationary PCs and on mobile devices. This eliminates the need for installing other software. Under certain circumstances, the browser settings may have to be adapted (e.g., to allow pop-ups).

Moodle is testing the following browsers for their executability and compatibility with the Moodle Learning Platform:

- Google Chrome
- Firefox
- Edge
- Safari (as of version 8)
- Mobile Safari

#### **Technical alternatives**

With the Moodle apps, the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform can also be used independently of the browser.

Moodle provides apps for the following operating systems:

- iOS
- Android
- Windows 10



The Moodle apps permit offline use of the Learning Platform. To be able to download the HIT learning package, you will need to access it online once.

The contents of the HIT learning package can be updated only in online mode.

First steps

# 2.1 Logging in

### **Initial login**

The description below shows the steps that are required for initial login.

Proceed as follows for initial login:

- Visit the link from the e-mail with your access data (www.hit.heidenhain-lms.de)
- Your default browser opens the login page of the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform.
- ► Enter your username and password from the e-mail with your access data
- Press Log in
- > The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform prompts you to change your password.
- Follow the instructions for changing the password



Minimum requirements for passwords:

- Eight characters
- One uppercase letter
- One lowercase letter
- One number
- One special character
- When you have changed the password successfully, the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform will prompt you to accept the Terms of Use.
- ▶ Accept the Terms of Use on the second page
- > The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform opens your personal start page.



For subsequent logins, you need only enter your username and the changed password.

If you add the login page to your bookmarks or favorites, you will not need to use the link from the e-mail.





## Initial login with Moodle apps



Before you use any of the Moodle apps, perform the initial login described above in your browser.

Proceed as follows for login in the app:

- Start the app
- ▶ Enter the URL www.hit.heidenhain-lms.de
- ▶ Press Connect
- > The Moodle app prompts you to enter your access data.
- Enter your username and password
- Press Log in
- Press Courses
- > The Moodle app shows an overview off all courses you are participating in.
- Press the download symbol
- > The Moodle app starts downloading your HIT learning package.



An existing WLAN connection is recommended for the download. The duration of the downloading process varies greatly depending on the available speed.

When the download is complete, you can also use the contents offline.



Information on the Moodle apps is provided on the Moodle websites and on the websites of the store and shop operators.

## 2.2 User interface

#### Overview

The following description provides a rough overview that is important for the subsequent explained content.



The visual appearance of the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform can vary depending on the device. Due to its responsive Web design, the arrangement and the depiction of the individual elements (navigation and page layout) change to match the format and resolution of the terminal.

Information on the Moodle apps is provided on the Moodle websites and on the websites of the store and shop operators.



The start page contains the following areas:

- 1 Main navigation menu
- 2 Functions navigator
- 3 Course Overview



If the main navigation menu is hidden, you can open it again by pressing the following icon:



# 2.3 Starting the HIT learning package

Start the HIT learning package as follows:

- ➤ Visit the link (title of the learning package) from the course overview (in area 3)
- > The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform displays the files belonging to the course.



- ▶ Press the link next to the **HTML document**
- > The HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform launches the HIT learning package in a new window.



If the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform does not launch the HIT learning package, check your browser settings. Pop-ups must be allowed.



# 2.4 Ending the HIT learning package

To end the HIT learning package, proceed as follows:

- ► Close the browser window of the HIT learning package
- > The browser will now close the pop-up window.

# 2.5 Logging out

To log out of the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform, proceed as follows:



- ▶ Open the functions navigator (area 2)
- Press Log out
- > The browser will now show the login page of the HEIDENHAIN Learning Platform.
